SHELL'S COMMUNITY IMPACT

EMPLOYMENT

- 1,300 full-time employees
- 800 long-term contractors
- In excess of 10,000 short-term contractors annually

ECONOMIC IMPACT

- Approx. \$125 million in 2015 in contracts in Heartland Region
- \$56.9M in taxes to Strathcona County



TURNAROUNDS

- Turnarounds are major maintenance events
- Upgrader turnaround wrapping up
- Refinery turnaround in September-October
 - Big piece is the tie in of the Hydrocracker debottleneck project



QUEST CARBON CAPTURE AND STORAGE

- Official opening in November
 - International attention
- Captured over 700k tonnes of CO₂ to date
- Very positive results
 - Better than anticipated capture rates, storage performance, efficiency
