Purpose

Project Overview



Scope

- 200-230 km of NPS 36 highpressure natural gas pipeline
- 18 MW (24,000 HP) of compression
- Two control stations

Community

- Up to 500 landowners, depending on final route
- 14 Indigenous communities identified for Legislated Consultation through the Alberta Alberta Consultation Office (ACO) (ACO)
- Early Engagement with 9Municipalities

Cost

- Current estimate of \$2.8 B
- Minimal to no cost impact on a typical residential bill

Timeline

- May 2023: Project scoping began
- Sep 2024: Initial AUC Need Application
- Fall 2025: AUC Facilities Application
- Fall 2026: Construction begins
- Q4 2027: Target in-service date



Community Engagement

Planned through fall 2024:



Extensive consultation with landowners and communities on communities on all identified routes.




Up to 550 km of route concepts
