Nutrien Fort Saskatchewan History

1983

Sherritt Gordon Mines Limited commissions the Fort Saskatchewan nitrogen fertilizer plant – a world class plant that boasts industry leading efficiency and reliability to this day.

1993

Sherritt Incorporated is formed and operates all fertilizer assets formerly operated under Sherritt Gordon Mines.

1996

Viridian Inc. is formed and takes ownership of all fertilizer assets formerly operated under Sherritt Incorporated.

1996

Agrium Inc. acquires 100% of Viridian Inc. fertilizer assets and begins operating as Agrium Inc., while Viridian becomes the holding company for historical liabilities, etc.

2018

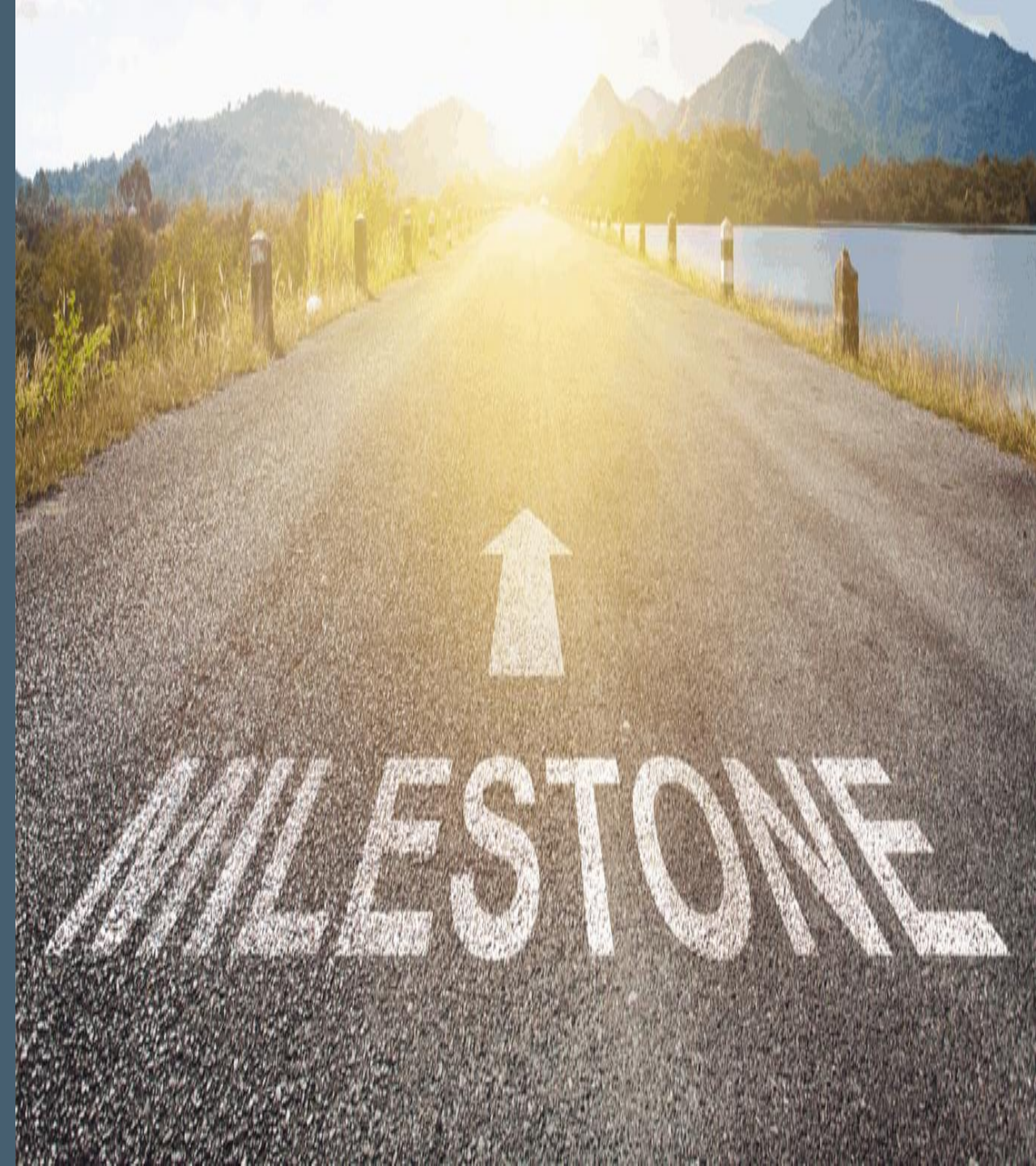
Nutrien Ltd. Is formed from the merger of PCS (aka Potash Corp) and Agrium Inc. and becomes one of the largest suppliers of N, P, K fertilizers in the world.

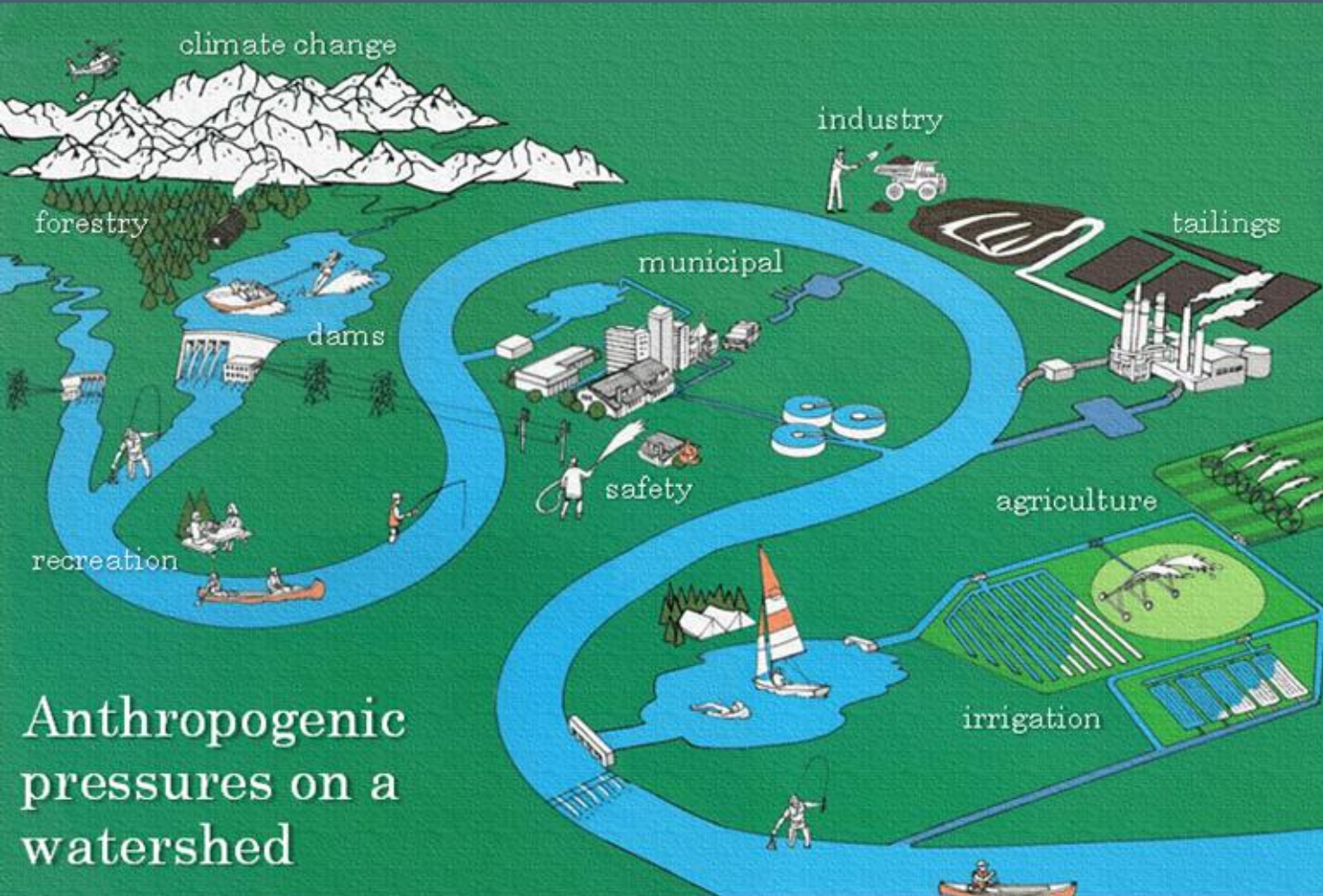

2025 Outlook

- At Fort Saskatchewan, the goal is maximum production time in 2025.
- We have no outages *planned*.
- In 2023, during our last major outage, we were able to incrementally increase our production capability. This has been an effective approach to Fort Sask. and other existing plants.
- Our next major outage is not scheduled until 2027.
- 2025 will see us focusing on incremental improvement in:
 - Safety. We are already world class but there are always opportunities to improve and *simplify*.
 - Environment. We are working with industry associations to navigate some new requirements in the works from AEP.
 - Emergency Response. While our ER program is very mature and fairly robust, we have started replacing some major pieces of equipment and will continue to do so over the next several years.
