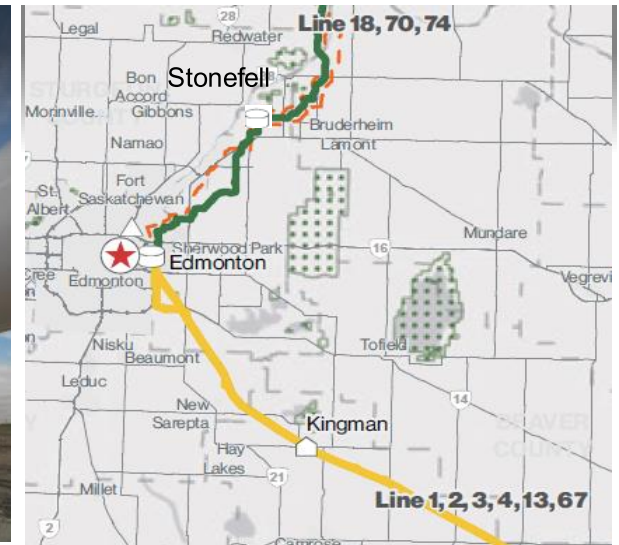

### Stonefell Terminal

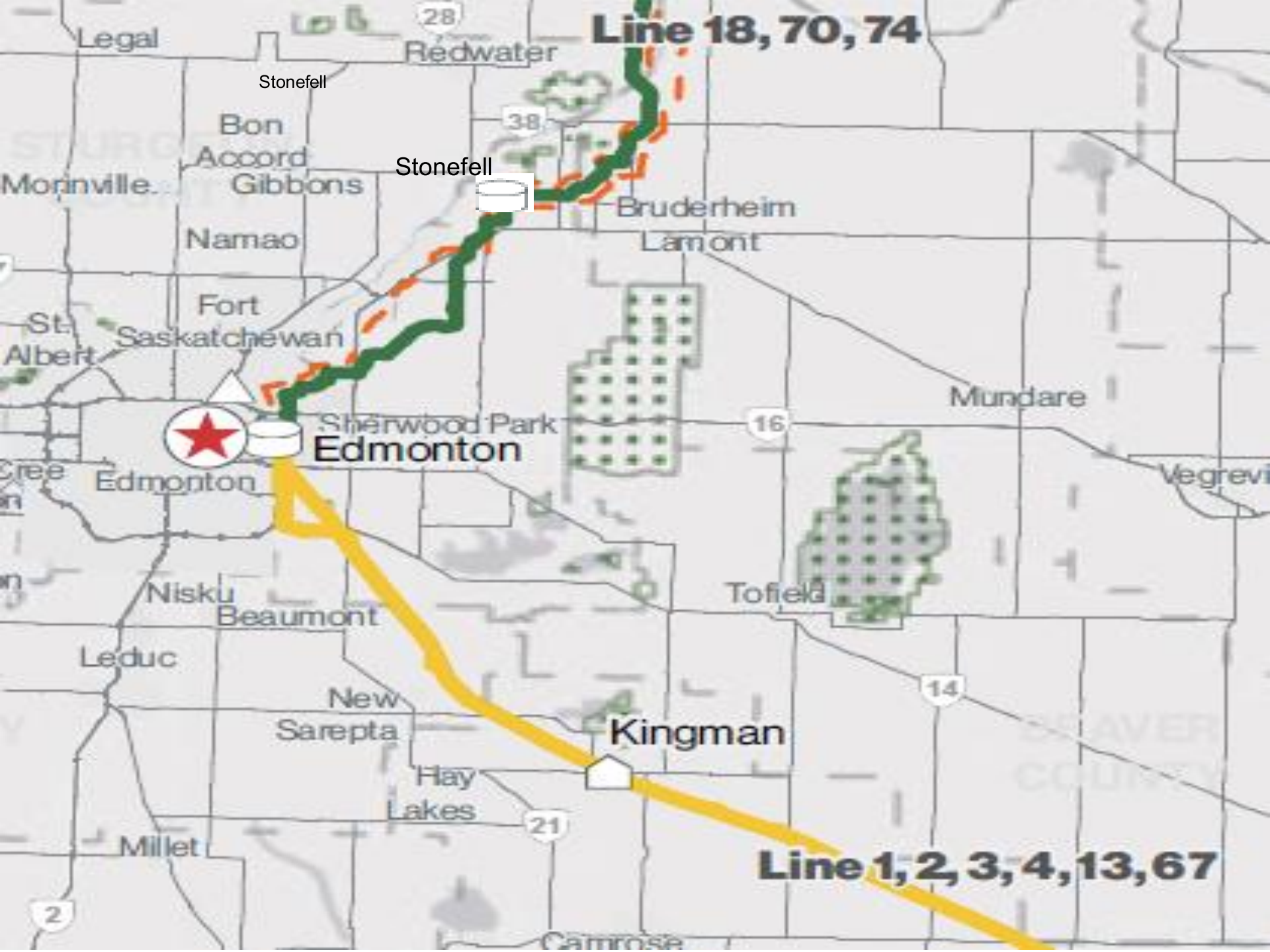
- Waupisoo (Line 18) Pump station infrastructure

NWR Refinery

### Status:

- Construction underway

## Northern Gateway Pipeline Project

Two proposed 1,177 km  
pipelines from Bruderheim,  
AB to Kitimat, BC

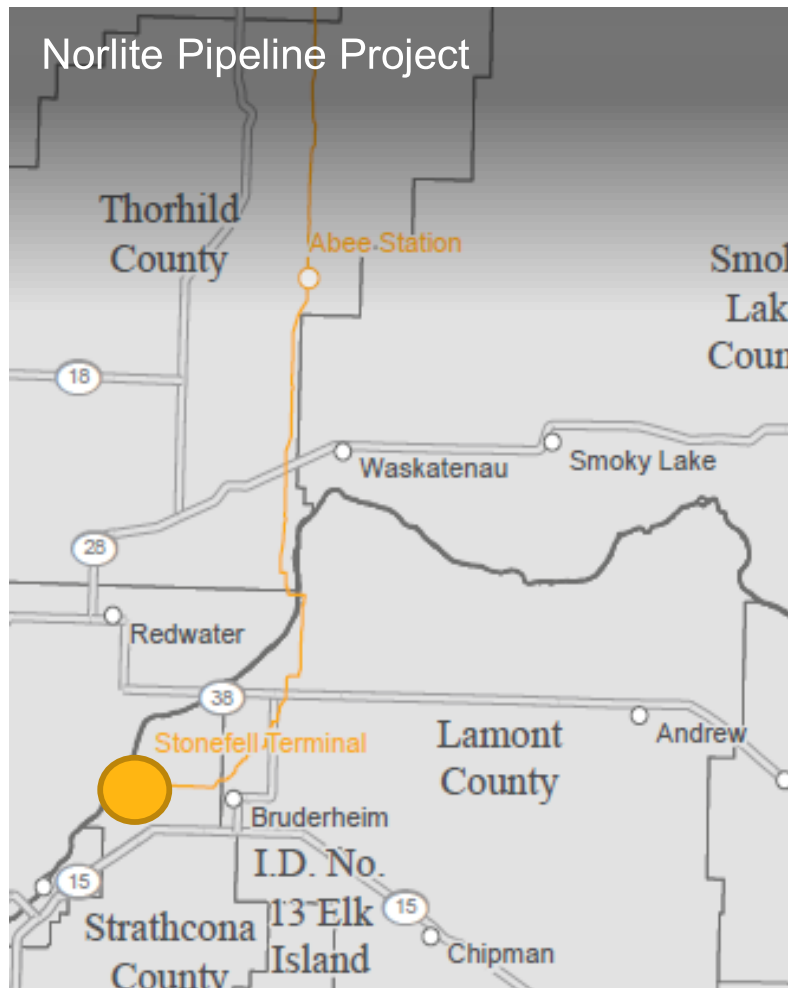
### Status:

## Upcoming Project Activity in the Heartland



### Norlite Pipeline Construction:

- Clearing activity complete
- Environmental survey work - June 2016
- Pipeline construction - Aug to Nov 2016

### Construction at Stonefell Terminal:

- Norlite:
  - Early civil work began in Sept 2015
  - Construction - April to Oct 2016
- NWR Connections at Stonefell:
  - Clearing activity began in March
  - Construction - July to Nov 2016
