Shell Scotford Overview

- Refinery
 - Diesel, Gasoline, Jet Fuel
- Chemicals plants
 - Building blocks for water bottles, foam food trays, truck bed liners, diapers, etc.
- Upgrader
- Converts bitumen into crude oilsQuest Carbon Capture and Storage
 - 1 million tonnes CO2 capture/yr

Tax & Economic Impact

- Approx. 1,300 employees, 500 long-term contractors and thousands of short-term contractors
- Approx. \$150 million annually in contracts in the region
- Approx. \$50 million in municipal taxes paid to Strathcona County in 2017 (excludes taxes collected for other levies, education)
 - 24% of consolidated county budget
 - \$500/resident or \$1,400/residence



Energy Efficiency

- Scotford uses ~65% of the energy of a standard comparable refinery
- It is the most energy efficient facility of its type in the world
- And we're looking at ways to improve upon our current leadership position



Quest Carbon Capture & Storage

- One million tonnes CO₂ per year capacity
 Equiv to emissions from ~250,000 cars
- Permanent storage 2 km underground
- Quest has captured, transported, and safely stored over 2 million tonnes of CO₂
- Quest has the global CCS record for capture in a one-year period (1.2 Mt)
- Quest is seen as the project to learn from by the global community
 - Delegations from around the world come to see, learn from Quest
 - Shell at COP 23 and at the Globe forum to profile Quest



Unlocking Technology

- Drone program
 - Safety focus
 - Innovation
 - Cost reduction



Fuelling Kindness

- Positive messages left at 22 elementary schools on first day back (Aug. 30, 2017)
- Delivered 314 pies on Pi Day to over 5 dozen organizations (Mar. 14, 2018)
- Acts of kindness completed in Sherwood Park, Fort Sask, Bruderheim
- \$115,000 donated via Community Service Fund in 2017
- 30+ Days of Caring completed to date in 2017
- 30+ organizations received silent/live auction donations
- 2017 Christmas video had ~ 2 million views
